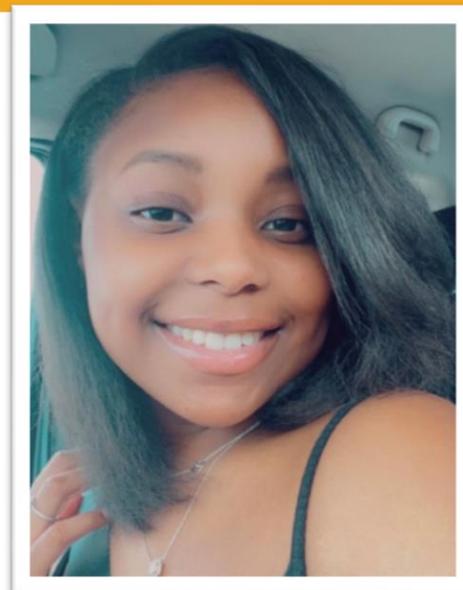


## Seven Questions with an RCM Scholar
